The Government believes that the Pupil Premium, which is additional to main school funding, is the best way to address the current underlying inequalities between Looked After Children, children in the Armed Forces and children eligible for Free School Meals (FSM) (or who have been in receipt of them in the past 6 years), by ensuring that funding to tackle disadvantage reaches the pupils who need it most.

It is for schools to decide how the Pupil Premium, allocated to schools is spent, since they are best placed to assess what additional provision should be made for the individual pupils within their responsibility.

Schools are required to publish the amount of money received and how they have chosen to spend this money.

At Corringham Church of England Primary School the amount received or to be received is as follows:

Allocated Funding 2015-16 = £21020

Nature of support

The funding received from Pupil Premium has been allocated in the following ways:

- Employing additional adult support in order to deliver interventions.
- Employing a qualified teacher to deliver booster sessions for small groups.
- Providing home access for pupils to Espresso Home - an online learning platform.
- Subsidising residential visits and trips.
- Staff attending PP conference
